REUNION 2025

Portland, Maine - Oct 2025

As previously noted, Sherry of "A Complete Reunion", who planned the last few Thomas C. Hart reunions, has retired and closed the company. We've decided to go with Armed Forces Reunion/Book My Reunion as the reunion planner for our 2025 reunion. AFT will handle registration and collecting money, but we are on our own for planning tours.

I've been in touch with Chris at Maine Tour Connections to start planning for the tours. She will get back to me with info on suggested tours. In late December/early January we'll post a survey on the TCHVA website to see which tours have the most appeal. By the end of January 2025 I should be able to get back to Chris with our input and start nailing down the schedule. The end goal is to have a registration form out to our shipmates by April 2025.

Some items to mull over while we wait for info from Chris and the posting of the survey: Would like to stick to our traditional schedule of three days of tours (Wed-Thurs-Friday) or trim that down to just one or two days? Do you want to take harbor or bay cruises, or stick to dry land? Do you prefer being dropped off at a spot and allowed to wander, or do you prefer sticking with the group at each site? In addition, I'd especially welcome input from those of you who have been in this part of Maine, letting us know what things you recommend.

HART IN HISTORY – FIRST MED DEPLOYMENT 1975 Part 3

- 22 November: Hart was in the battle group when the Kennedy collided with the Belknap. It was close to taps when the voice of LT Hunt, the OOD, came over the 1MC: "There has been a collision between the Kennedy and the Belknap. There is a huge fire. All hands man rescue and assistance stations." We were about two miles away at that time. I immediately ran topside and saw the Kennedy highlighted by fire. My first thought was "Oh my God; we've lost the carrier." Then the perspective changed and the Kennedy slid away revealing that the flames were all from the Belknap. The entire midsection was ablaze, and survivors gathered on the focsle and fantail. We could see the Belknap's firefighting crews bravely tackling the fire. We started to approach to help fight the fires, but then were ordered off. Instead, our small boats took injured sailors off the Belknap and brought them to Hart while two other task force ships, the Bordelon and one other, went in close to fight the fire. Hart's helo deck allowed for the more severely injured sailors to be transferred to the Kennedy or other medical facilities. Hart carried about 20 or more survivors for a few days until they debarked on the 26th.

A few days after the collision, when Hart still had Belknap sailors onboard, we came across a body floating in the ocean. We stopped and launched our motor whale boat to recover the body. All we could tell at that point was that the body had on dark clothing, similar to a sailor's dungarees. I was on the bridge wing with Captain Rohrbough and several of the Belknap sailors when the CO turned to one of the Belknap crew and said "That's one of your shipmates." I still remember the solemn expression on the sailor's face after that cruelly insensitive remark. As it turns out, once we had recovered the body it was determined that the victim was an Italian fisherman, based on the clothing, lira in the pocket, and other indicators. The body was soon heloed off the ship and turned in to authorities for identification.

- 28 Nov - 4 Dec: Bizerte, Tunisia. Camels, Arabs, goats and sheep in the streets, bazaars and bizarre in Bizerte. One sailor commented "This Tunisian writing is like that Greek stuff: it makes my eyes hurt to read it." There was a small American community in Bizerte, possibly associated with a US government office. Captain Rohrbough allowed them to come on board and use the ship's store. The ship's store was a 10x10 space with limited supplies. The guests sorely depleted the stock, especially snacks, music cassettes and tape players. Some of the crew were a bit miffed at the decimated offerings remaining in the store until the Captain pointed out that we'd be back home in a few weeks, but that was the only chance the Americans in Bizerte had to obtain US items for Christmas. He also reminded everyone that the ship's store profits benefitted the Welfare and Recreation fund, so the sailors would get some benefit from the money spent by our guests.
